But when spelling words are presented in the word families as shown, most students are able to learn a lot of words quickly.Be on the lookout for more long vowel word families to add to this list. For example, a starting point for many first grade spelling lists are: DAD and MOM. Children then start to expand the list by working through "word families". From DAD, they would cover BAD, SAD, HAD, and MAD. Also, they might vary the vowel and go to DID. From there children could shift to CAT, BAT, FAT, and SAT as well as CAR and BAR. In first grade, spelling skills should grow to cover the blends such as T plus R make the TR sound such as in TREE. F and R blend to make the FR sound in FROG. Remember, every child learns at a different rate, so what works for 85% of the students, may not be the correct approach for your child.
