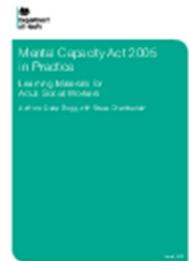


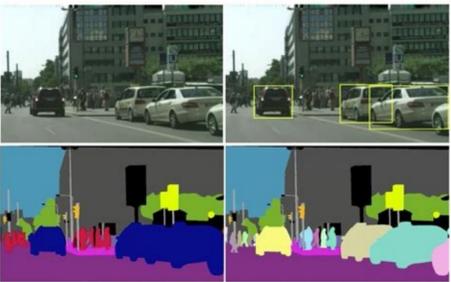
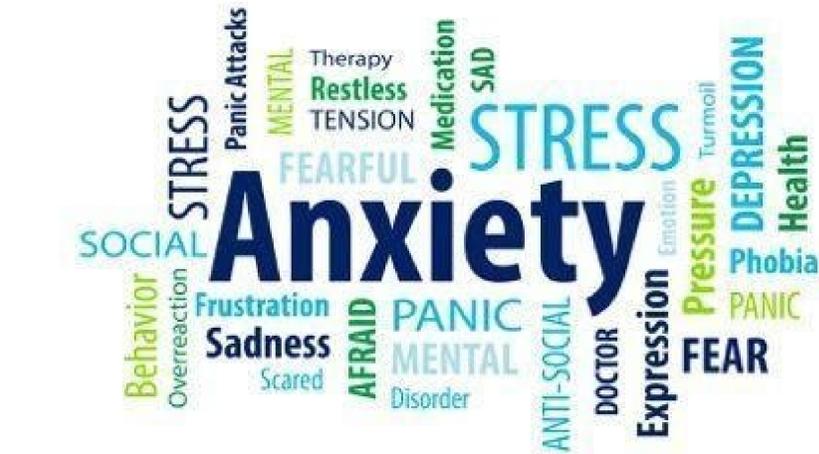

It is still very common for people to be assumed to have no mental capacity because of a diagnosis - dementia, or a disability of learning - or because they are very old. But the law makes it much simpler than that. Mental capacity is simply the ability to make a decision when it needs to be done. This includes the ability to make a decision that affects Day Life - as when you get up, what to wear, either to buy something, whether to go to the doctor - as well as more serious decisions: a € € surgery, or do a will, or pass to live somewhere else. The starting point should always be to assume that a person has a capacity to make a specific decision, although some people need some help. And sometimes someone makes a decision that other people think that it is reckless, how to refuse a treatment or play a dangerous sport. But these reasons are not reasons to decide that someone has no capacity for that decision. Who should evaluate the capacity? The person who evaluates someone's ability to make a decision will usually be the person who is directly worried about that person at the time. So, different people will be involved in the evaluation of someone ability to make different decisions at different times. In most day-to-day decisions, this will be the person who cares about them on the time. An assisting worker may need to evaluate if you can agree to take a shower. The District Nurse can evaluate if they can consent to exchange a dressing. The evaluation should be done in the balance of the probabilities - is it more likely than not the person has no capacity? You must always start from the assumption that the person has the ability to make the decision in question (Principle 1). Variations in capacity The MCA covers all kinds of decisions, large and small. Who should evaluate the capacity? The MCA is designed to empower those in health care and social assistance to make capacity assessments, rather than relying on expert tests by psychiatrists or psychologists - good professional training is fundamental. This can be everyday life, such as to use or eat, through more serious or complex decisions, about, for example, where to live, whether or a surgery or how to manage finances or property. By suffering from depression, an individual may be unable to make a decision, but when recovered can. Register to keep what and when registering vary. The Mental Capacity Law 2005 (MCA) provides a statutory framework for people who have no ability to make decisions by themselves, or who have capacity and want to prepare the preparations for a while they may not have capacity in the future.
