Congress will have the power to deposit and collect taxes, duties, levies and cozy, to pay debts and provide for the common defense and general welfare of the United States; But all duties, taxes and excise duties will be the same throughout the United States; Borrow money on the credit of the United States; Regulate trade with foreign nations and between different states, and with Indian tribes; Establish a uniform naturalization rule and uniform bankruptcy laws throughout the United States; To monetize, adjust the value of it, and foreign currency and set the standard of weights and measures; To provide for the punishment of counterfeiting of securities and current currency of the United States; Establish post offices and post offices; To promote the progress of science and the useful arts, ensuring that authors and inventors have the exclusive right to their writings and discoveries for a limited period of time; Establish courts subordinate to the Supreme Court; Define and punish piracans and felonies committed on the high seas and crimes against the law of nations; Declaring war, granting letters of marching and retaliation, and making rules concerning land and water capture; Raise and sustain armies, but no allocation of money for such use should be in the long term of two years; Provide and maintain a navy; Making rules for government and regulation of land and naval forces; Provide for the recall of the militia to enforce the laws of the Union, suppress insurgencies and repel invasions; To provide organization, insertion and discipline, the militia and to govern such parts of them as they may be employed in the service of the United States, reserving respectively to the United States, the appointment of officers and the training authority of the Militia according to the discipline prescribed by Congress; To exercise exclusive legislation in all cases anything other than that district (not exceeding ten square miles) as it may, by cession of particular states, and the acceptance of Congress, becomes the seat of government of the United States, and to exercise as authority over all places acquired by the consent of the legislature of the State in which the same is, for the erection of forts, magazines, arsenals, meters of oranges, and other necessary buildings;-and make all laws that will be necessary and correct to carry out the foregoing powers and all other powers acquired by this Constitution in the government of the United States, or in any department or officer.
