The countdown to Christmas is on!As Santa and his elves put the finishing touches on this year's toys, kids may be wondering how to send Jolly Ol' St. Nick their 2024 Christmas wish list. Giving Santa a few hints ahead of the holiday is as easy as calling his personal number or writing a letter detailing what they hope to find under the Christmas tree and dropping it in the mail.Wondering what Santa Claus' address is? Fortunately, we've got everything you need to know right here.With the help of the USPS and Operation Santa, we've got all the details on Santa's official mailing address for letters, important dates to note this year and what to expect once you've dropped your correspondence in the mail.You'll also learn how to give Santa a helping hand, because as everyone knows, he's got an awful lot on his plate this time of year.Whether you've been naughty or nice, here's what to know about sending Santa Claus a letter this year.How to write a letter to Santa ClausThe best letters to Santa are from the heart. That said, there are a few things that make it easier to send Santa mail, starting with using one of the U.S. Postal Service's Santa templates. There are a variety to choose from and they can be downloaded directly from the USPS website, printed off and then filed out. If you choose to write your own original creation, it's best to make sure letters are legible and contain the following information:Full name and address in the letterGift wish list in order of preferenceDetailed information on the requested itemsReasonable price rangeWhat is Santa Claus' address?Once your letter is complete, put it into an envelope. Add a First-Class stamp in the upper righthand corner, your complete return address on the upper lefthand corner and mail to:Santa123 Elf RoadNorth Pole, 88888When are Santa's letters due?While you can send Santa a letter anytime of year, if you'd like to receive a response, letters absolutely need to be postmarked no later than Monday, Dec. 9. If you send your letter after the December deadline, it's likely you won't hear back.What is Operation Santa? Plus, how to participateIf you're interested in helping Santa deliver gifts this year, here's what you need to know to pitch in: Visit Operation Santa on the USPS website and create an accountOnce you've done so, "adopt" a letter by an individual or familyAfter choosing a letter, decide on which gift or gifts you'll fulfill and purchaseGifts must then be shipped (at the expense of the adopter) to the recipientBoxes must be shipped no later than Monday, Dec. 16 by 8 p.m. ET to ensure they arrive by Christmas.Additional facts on sending Santa Claus mailAnyone in the continental U.S., Hawaii, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands can participate in the Operation Santa programThough many letters will be answered, there's no guarantee all letters will receive a response or will be posted on the USPS site.There's no age limit on letter-writing. You write him a letter, of course! The North Pole is now accepting wishlists from little ones through the United States Postal Service, making it easier than ever to get a message to the big man. Keep reading to learn how to write letters to Santa and where to send those letters. We've even created the most adorably festive templates that you can print, fill out, then put in the mailbox. We know he's anxiously awaiting to hear from you. Download the Santa letter templates here.How do I write a letter to Santa?Santa Claus has been making Christmas wishes come true for as long as we can remember—and for the last 100 years, the United States Postal Service has helped get those wishes right to his workshop. Here's how it works: kiddos will write a letter, stick it in an envelope with Santa's address, then send it! USPS Operation Santa will use a little Christmas magic to do the rest.For the letter itself, break out the markers and paper, then get creative! Santa Claus receives a lot of letters each year, so you'll want to make it special. When it comes to writing, you can create a gift wishlist or just write a sweet Christmas message. Santa will love either! If you choose to ask for a few presents, be sure to list the gifts you want in order of preferences, be specific about what you want, and don't ask for gifts that are too expensive. Santa has to deliver to everyone, you know. Most importantly, you'll want to write legibly and be sure to include your full name and address in the letter. If you want to decorate your letter to Santa, feel free—he loves all things merry and bright! Think: drawings, stickers, glitter, and more. Just be sure to leave out any 3D art as heavier letters are hard for the elves to deliver. Oh! And be sure Santa and his elves have enough time to make your gift by getting your letter written and postmarked by December 11.praetorianphoto/Getty ImagesWhere can I send Santa his letter?So, where should you send your letter? According to USPS, Santa's official mailing address is:Santa123 Elf RoadNorth Pole, 88888That's what you'll need to write on the envelope! To ensure Santa receives your note, double check that you've written his address correctly. You'll also need to include your full name and return address (including any building or apartment numbers) in the upper left corner of the envelope, and attach a First-Class stamp in the upper right corner. Lastly, place it in the mailbox or drop it off at your local post office. Next thing you know, your letter will be en route to The North Pole.A few other things to note: If several family members are sending letters, you can include all of them in one envelope, but you'll need to use additional stamps depending on the weight. If letters are being written and sent from an organization or classroom, send each letter individually. skynesher/Getty ImagesWhat is Operation Santa?Thousands of letters to Santa arrive at USPS each year, and now, the Operation Santa program lets people adopt and respond to those letters. According to USPS, if you send a letter to Santa's address listed above, it will be sorted, read, and published on the USPS Operation Santa website (with personal information redacted, so it's perfectly safe). Then, adopters can browse letters and respond with gifts and a note. You can submit a letter even if you don't have a USPS Operation Santa account—any letters sent to the address above that include a stamp will be included on the site. Though, the USPS cannot guarantee receipt of letters or that an adopter will choose your letter. Other Ways to Send a Letter to SantaIf you don't want your wishlist to be a part of the program, there are a few other ways to send a letter to Santa! If your family has an Elf on the Shelf, you can simply leave your letter with your Scout Elf and they will fly it back to The North Pole during one of their overnight trips to report to the big man. We're sure he'll also be told you're on the nice list! You could also personally hand it to Santa himself at one of the many places you can meet him. Or just simply stick your note in the mailbox without a stamp. No matter how you send your letter, special holiday spirit will guide it on its way! Find out how to get an official North Pole postmark and have it arrive in the mail too below. While you could pay for a service to get a letter from Santa, I really prefer this method instead. Just follow the directions below to get your letter FROM Santa postmarked and sent to your child in the mail from the North Pole. Not only is it free (except for the cost of postage), but it allows you to create a response that is totally personalized for your child and even hand written. This is because YOU will write the letter or Santa's response (so make sure you read your child's letter before they send it!) It's also easy to pull off these Santa letters since it really arrives in the mail! Now that the kids have created their list, it's time to get them mailed and receive a response from Santa! The USPS has a great system in place that allows parents to help Santa reply to their kids letter and receive a postmarked envelope with an official North Pole postmark. Have your child write a letter to Santa and then address their letter to "Santa Claus, North Pole". Stamp and mail the letter. Or, if you're like me, fake mailing it and keep the letter for your child to open when they are older. (I'm thinking it would be a great surprise graduation or wedding gift!) Write "Santa's" reply on a new piece of paper or better yet, write it on the BACK of your child's letter to Santa. Put it in a standard-sized envelope addressed to your child and marked FROM Santa Claus, North Pole and seal it. Don't forget to place 1st class postage on this envelope! TIP: Have a friend write it or just use the computer so that handwriting can't be recognized. Put this reply letter in a larger envelope and mail it to: North Pole Holiday PostmarkPostmaster4141 Postmark Dr Anchorage, AK 99530-9998 Santa's "reply" will be mailed to you with a special North Pole postmark! We recommend sending your letters by December 1 so that they can be received by the Anchorage, AK Postmaster no later than December 10. Santa's helpers in Anchorage, AK, will take care of the rest!
