The new owner will then need to pay the applicable fees and taxes, and submit the required paperwork to the Punjab RTO (Regional Transport Office). A duly filled-in Form 28 & Form 29 - Notice of Transfer of Ownership of a Motor Vehicle. This form can be obtained from the Punjab Regional Transport Office (RTO) where the vehicle is registered. 2. A duly filled-in Form 31 & Form 32 - Application for Registration of a Motor Vehicle. This form can also be obtained from the RTO where the vehicle is registered. 3. The original Certificate of Registration (RC) book of the vehicle. 4. The original emission certificate, if applicable. 5. A valid insurance certificate for the vehicle. 6. A valid pollution under control certificate for the vehicle. The transfer fee as applicable, which can be paid in cash or by demand draft drawn in favour of "The Secretary, State Transport Authority, Punjab". A fee of Rs.150/- in case of two wheelers and Rs.300/- in case of motor car is required to be paid as transfer fee. The Vehicle Ownership Transfer Online in Punjab costs starting from Rs.300 to Rs.2000, depending upon the vehicle's age and RTO. Through this app, users can easily transfer a car to their name or pay any type of taxes and fees due to them. Let's walk you through the process. Process of Car Transfer in Punjab Firstly, download the ePay Punjab app on your iOS or Android devices. After opening the app: Click on Excise and Taxation. Choose a car transfer. Enter the vehicle's registration number which you intend to transfer. This will generate the necessary credentials, including the owner's name, last paid token tax, and transfer fee. Click on generate challan, and you will be given a unique PSID number to pay the transfer fee. After paying, a reference number will be generated against which the car seller and buyer can provide biometric identification in their nearest NADRA offices. After both parties have done this, you can get your car inspected at the Excise office, and your car will be successfully transferred. This process does not require any excessive documents like a car's file, forms, etc., and can be done pretty easily. They have the necessary equipment and access to the relevant databases to verify the biometric data of both the buyer and seller.By completing biometric verification at either a NADRA facility or the excise department, individuals can ensure that their vehicle ownership transfer process is secure and in compliance with the regulations in Punjab. This step helps protect all parties involved from potential fraud or identity theft and adds an extra layer of protection to the transfer process.Transfer fee: Fee varies depending on the vehicle's engine power and province When transferring car ownership in Punjab, it's important to understand that the transfer fee you'll be required to pay will depend on two main factors: the engine capacity of the vehicle and the province where you're registering it.The transfer fee is typically higher for vehicles with larger engine capacities.
